This statement must include the name and date of birth of the person for whom the exemption is being requested. These statements do not need to be notarized, signed by a religious leader, or prepared by an attorney. They need to be kept on file but do not need to be submitted to the state for review or approval.</i></p>

Primarily applies to children on a catch-up schedule.</i></p>
